Using the Lawn Scarifier

- Wear your protective equipment including ear defenders and good strong footwear.
- Make sure the bag or box that catches the weeds and debris is fitted correctly.
- 3. Always hold the scariffer handle firmly with both hands while working.
- Keep your hands and feet clear of the tines at all times.
- Do not operate the scarifier on concrete or other hard surfaces. Injury or damage may
- Do not run the engine when moving over paving or hard ground, or when positioning the
- Do not tilt the scarifier to expose the tines if they are still rotating the tines can throw out small stones or other hard objects.
- While working, keep a lookout for any stones or other objects in your path. Stop and clear them out of the way.
- Stop the lawn scarifier if someone approaches you.
- Stop the engine before making any adjustments other than scarification depth, or before leaving the machine unattended.
- If the scarifier starts to labour and slow down, raise the scarification depth so you are removing less material. Make a second pass later, with a deeper setting.
- If debris or rubbish become tangled in the tines, stop the engine before clearing the blockage or working on the scarifier.
- 13. Make sure that the machine does not become clogged with dust and debris. Stop the engine if you need to clean the scarifier.
- 14. Always stop the engine before leaving the scarifier unattended.
- 15. Clean the machine at the end of each day, and before you return it to the hire company.
- If your scarifier has a folding handle, fold it after work, ready for storage or transport.
- 17. If your equipment does not work properly, do not attempt to repair it. Contact the hire

Lawn Scarifier

- Plan the use of the Lawn Scarifier so that it can always be used
- Petrol is highly flammable. Take care not to cause a fire or
- This lawn scarifier is designed to remove moss, dead grass and weeds form your lawn.
- The action of this scarifier can cause injury or damage if the machine is not used in a careful and controlled way.
- Keep your hands and feet well away from the tines.
- If you have not used a petrol driven lawn scarifier before, practice the least important area of your lawn until you are confident that you are not damaging the grass.
- You must have at least the following items of personal protective equipment: ear muffs or plugs giving protection for levels up to 100dB(A); strong boots or shoes giving good foot protection; strong gloves for handling any rubbish in the grass.
- This machine must not be used by minors, or by anyone under the influence of drugs or
