



Using the Hydraulic Jack

- Safety boots and gloves must be worn.
- Other people should be kept clear.
- Position the jack under the correct loading point of the vehicle or plant being 3. If there is no loading point, position the jack under a suitable support point capable of taking the load.
- Check that the lowering valve is fully closed.
- If it is a vehicle being worked on, the wheels that remain on the ground must be chocked.
- 6. Do not out anything, including hands between the lifting pad of the jack and where it will contact the plant being lifted.
- Raise the jack slowly and carefully. Rapid raising could cause the plant to slip.
- Do not exceed the safe working load marked on the jack.
- Never leave anything jacked up for long periods without other support. Place an axle stand or other correct support in a safe position under a load bearing part of
- 10. When using axle stands or similar adjustable supports always ensure they are adjusted correctly. They must be standing on hard, flat, firm ground with the cradle located under good support points.
- 11. Never get under any plant being lifted until it has been adequately supported with axle stands or other proper supports.
- 12. Do not use bricks or blocks as supports: they will crumble without warning.
- 13. Do not attempt to reposition the jack or supports while they are under load.
- 14. Never leave anything jacked up needlessly. Always lower it to its normal position
- 15. Remove any tools or other items from under the plant before lowering it.
- **16.** Lower the plant and remove the jack as soon as work is finished.
- 17. Lower the plant to the ground slowly and carefully. Rapid lowering could cause the

- The force generated to lift heavy objects is enormous, keep fingers clear of all pressure points.
- This hydraulic jack is designed to partially lift heavy vehicles or plant.
- The action of this hydraulic jack can cause injury or damage if not used in a careful and controlled way.
- If the operator has not used a hydraulic jack before they should familiarise themselves with the equipment before starting work.
- The work should be thought out and planned ahead to ensure it is always carried
- The following items of personal protective equipment (ppe) will be required as a minimum:

Safety boots;

- This hydraulic jack must not be used by minors, or by anyone under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- This hydraulic jack is designed for operation by an able bodied adult. Anyone with either temporary or permanent disability must seek expert advice before using them.
